National Timing Report Information

Introduction

The ACA Timing Work Group is working toward standardizing and verifying timing accuracy at ACA National races. The goal for National races is to parallel the FIS Timing standards by using homologated timing equipment, use two timing systems and document timing information.

The v7.0 National Timing Report is mandatory during the 2007-2008 race season for all K1 and K2 provincial championships, the K2 Western & K2 National championships and National Masters championships. One report per day selected by the ROC & TD is required.

The v7.0 National Timing Report is recommended during the 2007-2008 race season for all National calendared races. One report per day selected by the ROC & TD.

The reports should be added to the PSO Race Packages and if possible added to the PSO Officials web site.

Forms are also available on the ACA web site www.canski.org in the Officials section.

Pre-requisites:

- Race package including the latest version National Technical Timing Report must be received by the ROC one month prior to the event. This includes downloading forms by the ROC.
- The assigned Technical Delegate must confirm the ROC did receive and the Chief of Timing understands the forms in his/her pre-race discussions.

Procedure:

1. The Technical Timing Report must be completed and signed by the Chief of Timing. The TD of the race must review the report by verifying the times and timing information prior to also signing the document.
2. The Technical Delegate's signature confirms the race should be scored for ACA points.
3. All Technical Timing Reports when electronically completed can be e-mailed to the National Officials Chair shales2@telus.net by the Chief of Administration &/ or Race Office no later than 2 days after the event..
4. Also, for the above listed Championship races send the Atlantic provinces, Quebec and Ontario timing reports to the East timing rep Camille Courchesne camille.courchesne@videotron.ca, Yukon, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia send to the West timing rep Dave Bartle djbartle@xplornet.com
